Once every five years, the City of Redding Housing Division prepares and submits to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) an updated Consolidated Plan (ConPlan) for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) and HOME Investment Partnership (HOME) programs. The ConPlan is a five-year planning document which: 1) identifies housing needs and problems; 2) analyzes market conditions and resources; 3) sets priorities and adopts strategies; 4) allocates resources; and 5) contains an annual plan with reporting obligations which tracks how monies are spent and how goals are accomplished.
